Commemorates Two Decades of Advancing Medical Education in India Over 130,000 healthcare practitioners trained across various specialties

Mumbai, October 7, 2013: Envisioning a better healthcare future for India, Johnson & Johnson took a pioneering step and established the Ethicon Institute of Surgical Education (EISE) in 1993.
